COURSE OBJECTIVES

Upon successful completion of the courses students will be able to:

- 1. Explain the importance of the care of flowers and plants.
- 2. Explain the importance of placing flowers in the correct setting.
- 3. Explain the structuring of an arrangement is much like building a house, i.e., framing is imperative to overall structure.
- 4. List what materials are incorporated into the mechanics of floral design.
- 5. Make a simple corsage, a country bouquet (round), an oblong centerpiece, a garden bouquet, the novelty, the Japanese art form, wedding designs and simple funeral pieces.
- 6. Describe what is expected of an employee and how to be the most help in a flower shop.

 - 3.1. Class will make a round arrangement
- 4. Class Will Make a Novelty Fresh Flower Arrangement With an Unusual Container
 - 4.1. Applying for a job will be discussed
- 5. Class Will Make a Dried Flower Arrangement.
 - 5.1. The boxing, packaging of flowers for delivery will be discussed
- 6. The Class Work Will Consist of Working With Permanent or Silk Flowers
 - 6.1. Discussion will focus on customer relations in the shop
- 7. The Japanese Form of Art Will be Studied With a Balance in Design as the Focus
 - 7.1. Cleaning flowers will be discussed
- 8. Class Will Make an Oblong Centerpiece
 - 8.1. Class discussion will focus on helping an employer with the promotion of the flower shop
- 9. Class Discussion Will Focus on Student Problems Concerning the Course
 - 9.1. Class will make a corsage.
