COURSE OBJECTIVES

At the end of the workshop the student will demonstrate an ability:

- 1. To pronounce Indochinese proper names.
- 2. To pronounce and understand a number of useful phrases in different Indochinese languages.
- 3. To Identify and explain the significance of some of the major linguistic differences between the Indochinese languages and English.
- 4. To explain how linguistic differences inhibit the acquisition of English.
- 5. To discuss some of the major cultural differences between English and the Indochinese cultures and how these affect classroom learning and behavior.
