This course is designed to provide older adult musicians the opportunity to use and develop their skills through group participation and performance. Instruction includes the study of symphonic, orchestral, concert, pop and/or seasonal literature with emphasis on ensemble disciplines and performance techniques. Students will gain an understanding of the fundamentals of music, conducting and rehearsal procedures. Students will learn sight reading techniques and how to perform in front of an audience. (FT)

- 7. Execute and interpret music through sight reading.

WRITING ASSIGNMENTS

Writing assignments may include, but are not limited to, written critiques of a concert and/or community band performance.

OUTSIDE ASSIGNMENTS

Outside assignments may include, but are not limited, performances and practice outside of regular class time.

APPROPRIATE ASSIGNMENTS THAT DEMONSTRATE CRITICAL THINKING

Assignments may include, but are not limited to the following:

- 1. Critically assess and derive meaning from works of music and the performance of musicians according to the elements of music, aesthetic qualities, and human responses.
- 2. Develop specific criteria for making informed critical evaluations of the quality and effectiveness of performances, compositions, arrangements, and improvisations and apply those criteria in personal participation in music.
- 3. Evaluate a performance, composition, arrangement, or improvisation by comparing each with an exemplary model.
- 4. Explain how people in a particular culture use and respond to specific musical works from that culture.
- 5. Describe the means used to create images or evoke feelings and emotions in musical works from various cultures.

EVALUATION

- 1. Attendance and group participation.
- 2. Participation at performances and rehearsals.
- 3. Observing improvement in intonation, rhythmic precision, balance, and tone production.
- 4. Successful performance before an audience.

METHOD OF INSTRUCTION

Lecture/laboratory, discussion, large and small group activities, rehearsals, individual and sectional rehearsal; and field trips. This course, or sections of this course, may be offered through distance education.
