COURSE GOALS

The initial applicant course (8 hours) will provide the student the necessary handgun safety skills and legal information to petition the county for a concealed carry weapon permit.

COURSE OBJECTIVES

This course will:

1. Provide the student with handgun safety training skills and current legal information related to weapons laws in the state of California and county of San Diego.
2. Prepare the student to successfully pass a skills and knowledge ten question multiple choice written test with an emphasis on new or changed laws/ordinances and a required minimum passing score of 75%.

SECTION II

COURSE CONTENT AND SCOPE

The refresher course will be 4 hours in length and will include the following topics/activities:

1. A Review and Explanation of New or Revised Laws and Ordinances (1 3/4 hours)
2. A Review of Safety Skills and Knowledge (1 3/4 hours)
3. Written Exam (1/2 hour)

Classroom application of safety practices and laws/ordinances to posed scenarios during the practical exercises.

EVALUATION

The method to be used to measure the student's understanding of the course material will be a ten question multiple choice test with a minimum passing score of 75%. The competency test will measure the student's knowledge of safety skills, but with a heavy emphasis on changes in the weapons laws and local ordinances.

METHOD OF INSTRUCTION

Both the eight (8) hour initial applicant course and the four (4) hour refresher course will be conducted in a classroom setting. One instructor shall be assigned to teach each course. Class lectures will include the review and demonstration of handgun safety skills and the review and explanation of laws and ordinances related to handgun safety. Instructors will utilize, but not be limited to, PowerPoint, overhead slides and props to illustrate skills and knowledge of handgun safety.

The four (4) hour refresher course will provide the student the necessary refresher safety skills and updated legal information to petition the county for a renewal of a concealed carry permit renewal.

The instructor will provide copies of any required handouts.

Students will be expected to provide their own notebooks and writing materials. Additionally students will be allowed to tape the presentation for their own use if so desired.
