So, what will I learn?

This is the catalog description for this class, which sums up what this class focuses on:

Student Learning Outcomes (SLO's)

- 1. Students make appropriate decisions to deliver proper nursing care within the nurse assistant's scope of practice using basic terminology.
- 2. Student applies the knowledge & skills practiced in skills lab to the clinical setting.
- 3. Students avoid injury to self and patients by utilizing safety measures prescribed by OSHA and CDC.

Upon completion of this course, the student will be able to:

- 1. Demonstrate an understanding of patient rights.
- 2. Explain the role of the Certified Nurse Assistant in California.
- 3. Perform basic nursing skills to state defined standards.
- 4. Identify and be able to apply key concepts in infection control, environmental safety, and emergency procedures.
- 5. Recognize abnormal changes in body functioning and report these changes to a supervisor in both verbal and written forms.
- 6. Modify and adapt nursing behavior as an appropriate response to the patient behavior, expressed or implied needs.
- 7. Identify and explain the implications of the developmental tasks associated with the aging process.
- 8. Communicate effectively and demonstrate appropriate basic nursing care and responses to the cognitively impaired patient.
- 9. Describe appropriate avenues to resolve grievance and disputes.
- 10. Provide needed assistance in getting to, and participating in, patient and family groups and other activities.
- 11. Perform basic restorative services.
- 12. Search careers and /or colleges on-line.
- 13. List three other allied healthcare occupations, education required, and local institutions where the education or training is accessible.
- 14. Describe a job interview, resume, and resources used for career development.

How will I log into Canvas?

To be successful in this class you will need to log into CANVAS on a daily basis for additional readings, assignments, handouts, and discussion board activities. We want you know that you will not be successful in this class unless you are checking the site regularly. Here is the link that walks you through how to log on:

- Type your Password: mmddyyyy (birthdate with no hyphens, slashes, or spaces)
 - For example: 0009010101 (ID number used at registration) 06031980 (password for birthdate June 3, 1980)

After saving your initial password, we advise all students to change your password using the following criteria for the password complexity options below in combination:

- Minimum length of password should be eight characters.
- Must have a combination of upper and lower case letters.
- Must have at least one number.
- Must have at least one special character.

Returning online students, use your current password.

How will my grade be determined? Letter Grade Assignment: Final grades assigned for this course will be based on the percentage of total points earned and are assigned as follows:

Explanation of assignments:

- 1. **Homework requirements** –Completion helps with exam prep. Assigned workbook is due before each exam.
- 2. **Expected Participation** To learn and master skills and materials, try to give 100% participation. If students not actively participating in lab or group assignments will be asked to leave for the day.
- 3. **Test:**13 multiple choice tests-25 questions, 2 skills test-25 points & 100 points, 100 question midterm & 125 question Final-multiple choice, matching, T/F. Will need 75% on tests.
- 4. **Lab Practice/Clinical-** we encourage every student to satisfactorily, competently, and safely perform skills while conducting self in a professional manner per standards of the healthcare industry.
- 5. **Class Discussions**-Every day, there will a post of either a case scenario or clinical skill with questions. You will need to follow the instructions and submit by the due date. Then respond to two different postings. Remember participation is key.

Policy on Academic Honesty

- 1. Students should actively participate in classroom activities.

 - It is not a good idea for students to copy the language or ideas of another person and use them as their own ideas.
- 3 An instructor will take the following steps if he/she thinks a student has been dishonest in completing a classroom assignment or test:
 - Discuss the situation with the student.
 Make sure that the student understands why his/her action is dishonest.
 - If the student did not understand that his action was dishonest, the instructor can give the student a warning.
 - If the student knew that his action was dishonest, the instructor can give him/her a failing grade.

Make up Exams: Throughout the course there will be specific days allocated to make-up exams. Any missed assignments will be upload to Canvas. You will make an appointment with your instructor to review and discuss the assignment. Please see the schedule.
