Apprenticeship Readiness Program Graduates 14th Cohort

In May 2025, the Apprenticeship Readiness Program-High Road Construction Careers (HRCC) proudly celebrated the graduation of its 14th cohort, with 23 students completing the program and earning over 170 industry-recognized certifications. Graduates are already making strides -many have joined union-led construction projects, while others are continuing their education within the San Diego Community College District. This milestone reflects the program's ongoing commitment to building strong career foundations and expanding opportunities in the skilled trades.

Accomplishments:

The program reached its 14th cohort, providing students with the tools and certifications required to jumpstart their careers in the trades.

This cohort includes 23 newly trained individuals with over 170 certifications earned in total.

Graduates are already working with unions, showcasing how the ARP program prepares and advances students in the construction industry.
