OVERVIEW OF THE MID-CYCLE VISIT

On April 29, 2021 faculty, classified professionals, and administrative leadership participated in a ½ day virtual accreditation mid-cycle progress visit. We hosted a visiting team of outside peer professionals that represented our accreditor, ACS WASC. The visiting team met briefly with the leadership team (SDCCE President Cortez, VPI Fischthal, VPSS Rivera Lacey, VPA Sabanos, Dean of PRIE Luedtke, Academic Senate President Bromma and Classified Senate President Kovrig) and then met in two one hour meetings with a group of faculty, classified professionals and managers.

“The purpose of the one-or two-day visit by a two-member team is to understand the school’s purpose, its program, and operations based upon the ACS WASC criteria and detailed school description.”

the April 29 interview, I realized that there were some unspoken victories that needed to be shared. I appreciated that the format was flexible enough to allow me to contribute highlights from student services as well as instructional services. Here is a summary of my comments:

Heroic efforts by student services, classified professionals, and faculty to coordinate delivery of computers and other devices to SDCCE students, faculty, and staff during spring 2020 - spring 2021.

14 volunteer Online Faculty Mentors stepped up and served hundreds of hours of one-to-one and group mentoring to support faculty transitioning to remote and online education in March 2020. These amazing efforts set the tone and pace for collaboration among faculty and staff during pandemic.

For many students, SDCCE has been a lifeline to student services, learning and engaging in the promise toward new jobs and careers during the pandemic. We applaud faculty and classified professionals who have used a variety of communications to stay in touch with students: phone, email, text, Canvas, Zoom, Pronto and other phone apps.

Many thanks to administration for promoting me/Ingrid Greenberg to 100% reassigned time as SDCCE Online Faculty Mentor Coordinator position. This position enabled leadership to scale a variety of online faculty mentoring spring 2020-present: one-to-one mentoring, group mentoring (program level, instructional level)

16 Online Faculty Mentors (compensated) have been supporting new and returning faculty with completing Online Faculty Certification Program late spring 2020-present. We are very proud to report that SDCCE improved Online Faculty Certification Program (OFCP) completion rate from pre-COVID 50% to January 2021: 87%." – Ingrid Greenberg, ESL Professor; SDCCE Online Faculty Mentor/Coordinator; Academic Senate Past President (2011-2013)

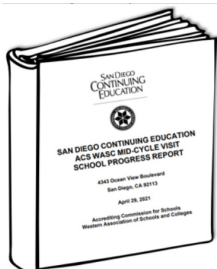

11. How SDCCE makes a difference is measurable. Once again, SDCCE changes lives.

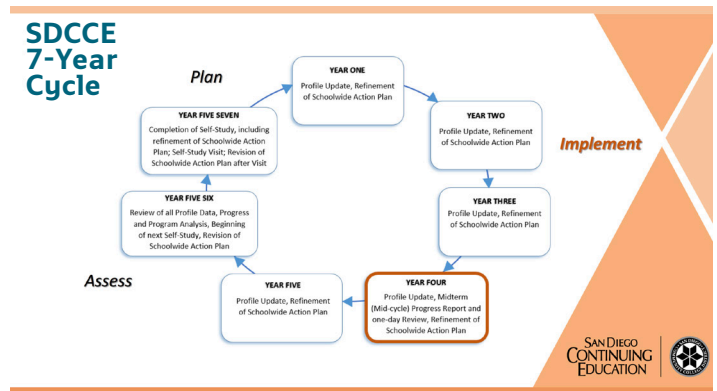
