Challenges

- Many of the unit plans reference collaboration with / support from additional departments; unknown if relationships have been established
- Inconsistency in the effort to update the annual plans
- Unit objectives are not linked to institutional objectives
- Lack of experience impacts the process

 - Develop Accreditation software




Next Steps
