- Add the following activity to your next department meeting.
- Writers that incorporate the following exercises into their department meeting to discuss faculty responses should experience a reduction in their time spent on program review, strategic plan and resource requests, and a better overall report.

Suggested Activity: Meet with stakeholders and identify program/department major strengths, weaknesses, opportunities and threats (SWOT) in achieving the program's/department's strategic plan by doing the following:

- 2. Have each group identify/list the program's SWOT for each strategic goal. The group should also list the resources needed to address the SWOT,
- 3. Have groups report out/share SWOT outcomes and common themes, and then
- 4. Revise goals and objectives and prioritize resource needs. *This part could be achieved at a follow-up program/department meeting if time runs out*.

Supplies: Provide last year's strategic plan.

This process helps to focus planning efforts for the upcoming year and supports and justifies requests for resources.
