The California Community College System and Noncredit History

Timeline of Noncredit Education 1850 – 2012

- Birth of adult education in California – 1850s
- Establishment of localized community college and K-12 districts both offering adult education – 1910s
- Development of a two-tiered credit/noncredit funding model – 1980s
- Non-Credit Categories (2006)
- Equalization of Funding:
 - credit and CDCP noncredit: \$5,004
 - Other noncredit: \$3,009

Noncredit Categories 2006

- Elementary and secondary basic skills [CDCP]
- English as a second language [CDCP]
- Immigrant education (which includes citizenship and workforce preparation) [CDCP]
- Parenting
- Short-term career technical education [CDCP]
- Older adult programs (designed for residents over 55 years of age)
- Programs for adults with disabilities
- Health and safety
- Home economics

Platinum Age of Adult Education 2014 -

- Student Success and Support Program (SSSP)
- Student Equity (SE)
- Adult Education Block Grant (AEBG)/consortia with K-12 adult schools
- Strong Workforce
- CCCCO recognition of professional development for noncredit

8 Large ($\geq 2,000$ FTES)

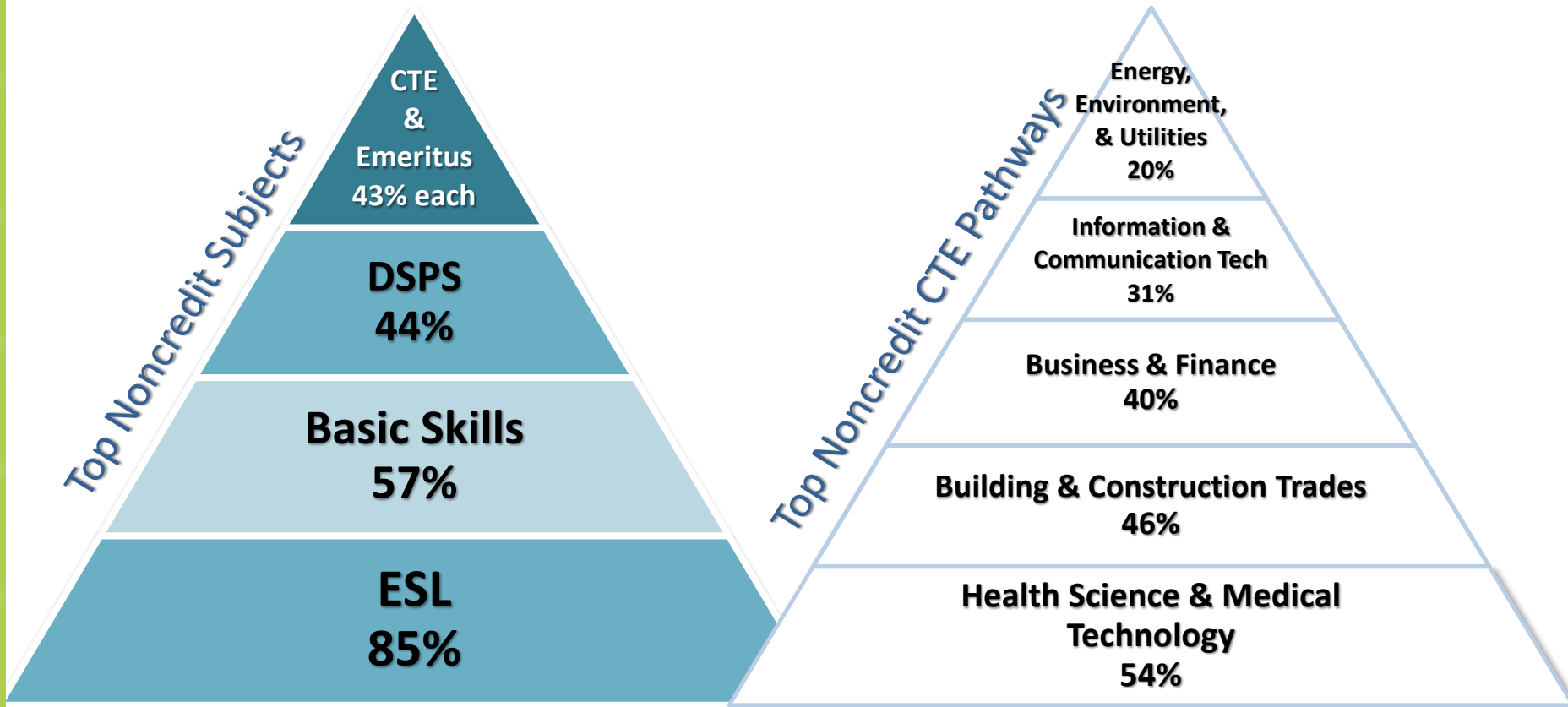
38 Medium (≥ 200 to $< 2,000$ FTES)

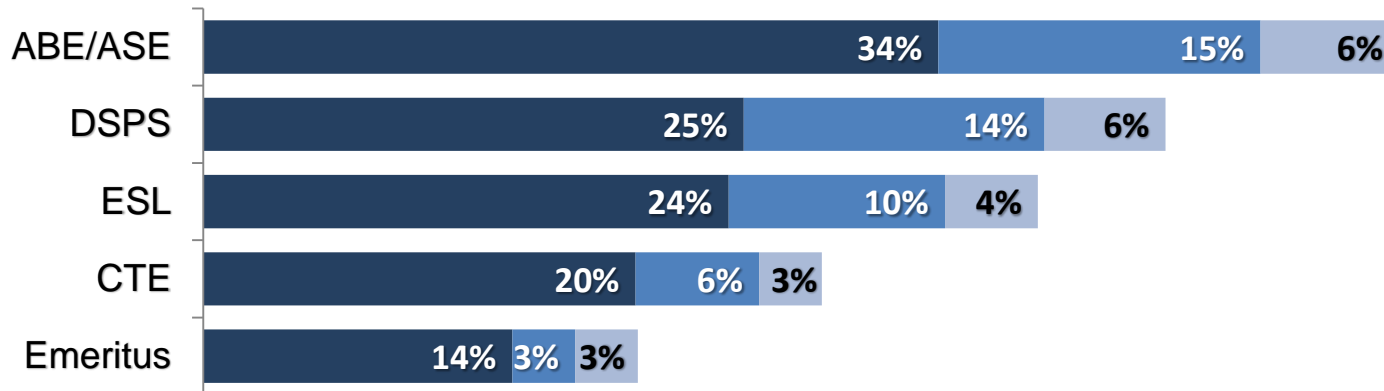
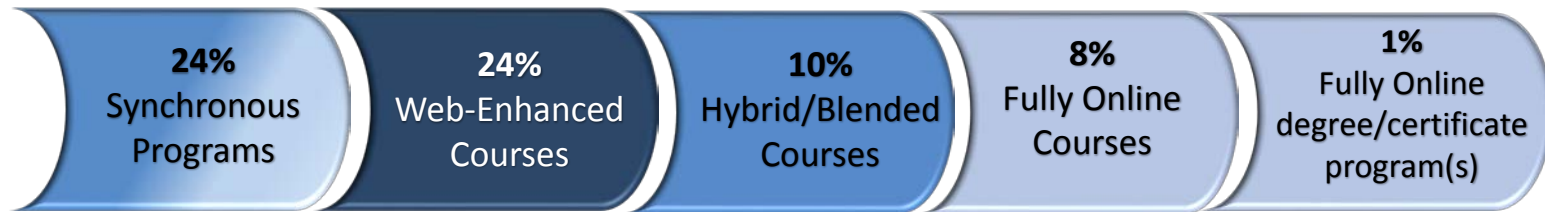
Distance Education

36% small

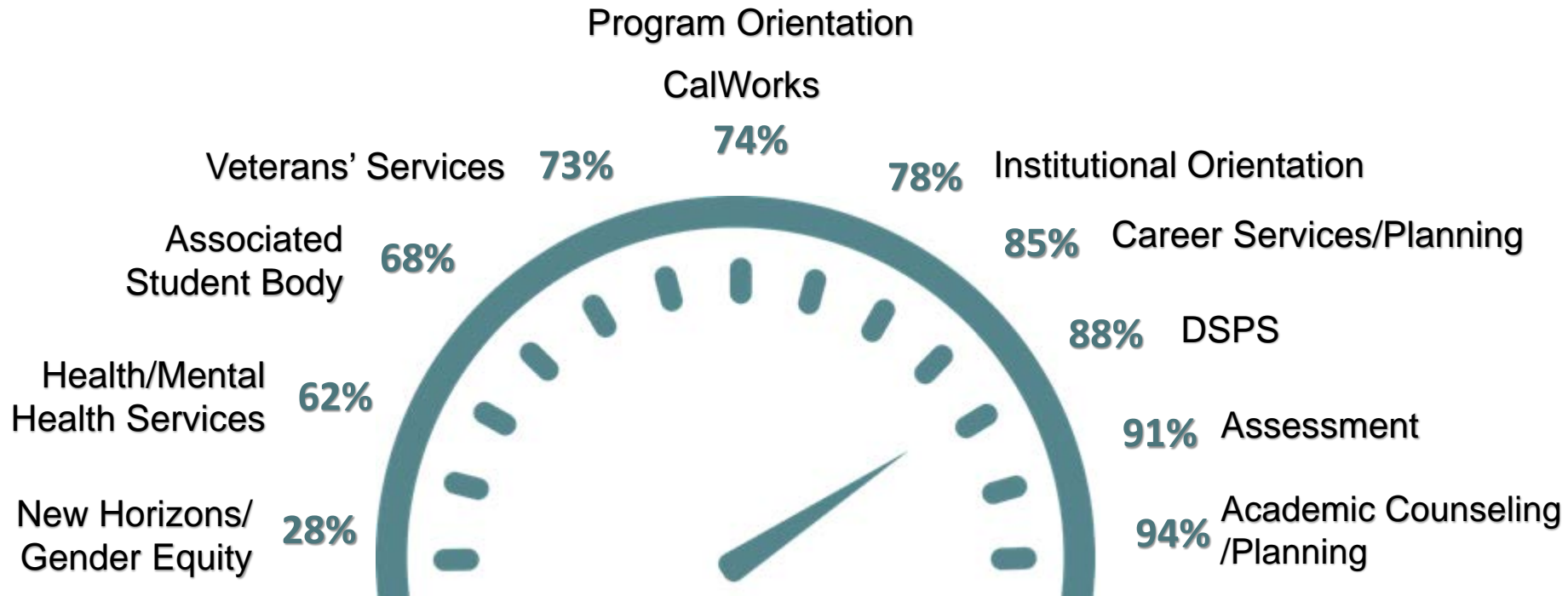

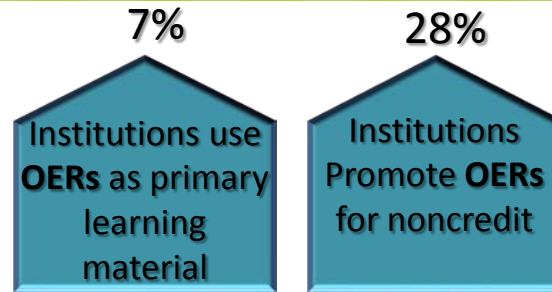
Student Support Services

98% of institutions with noncredit offer some form of **student support services** to noncredit students.

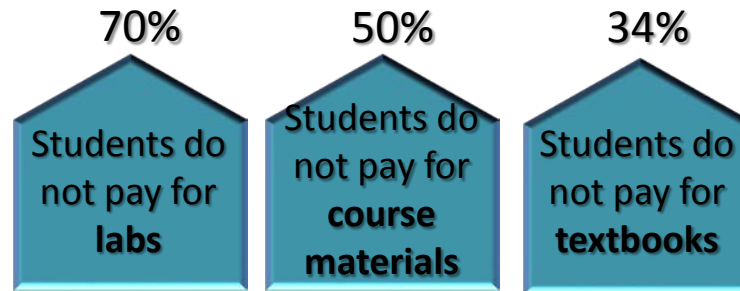

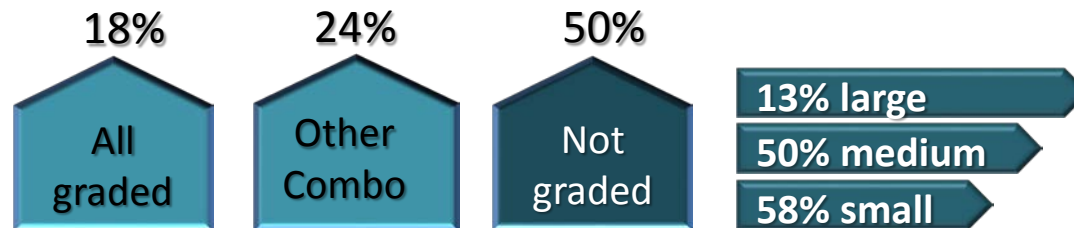

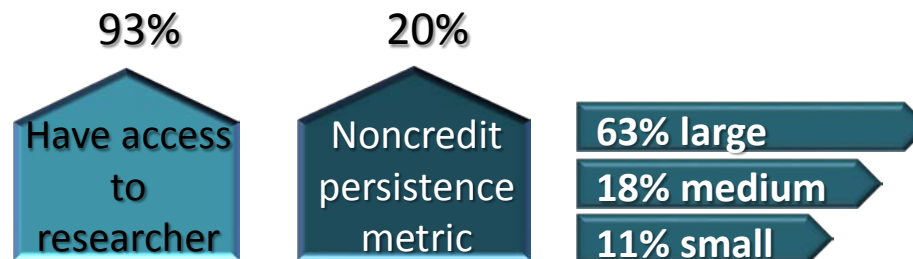

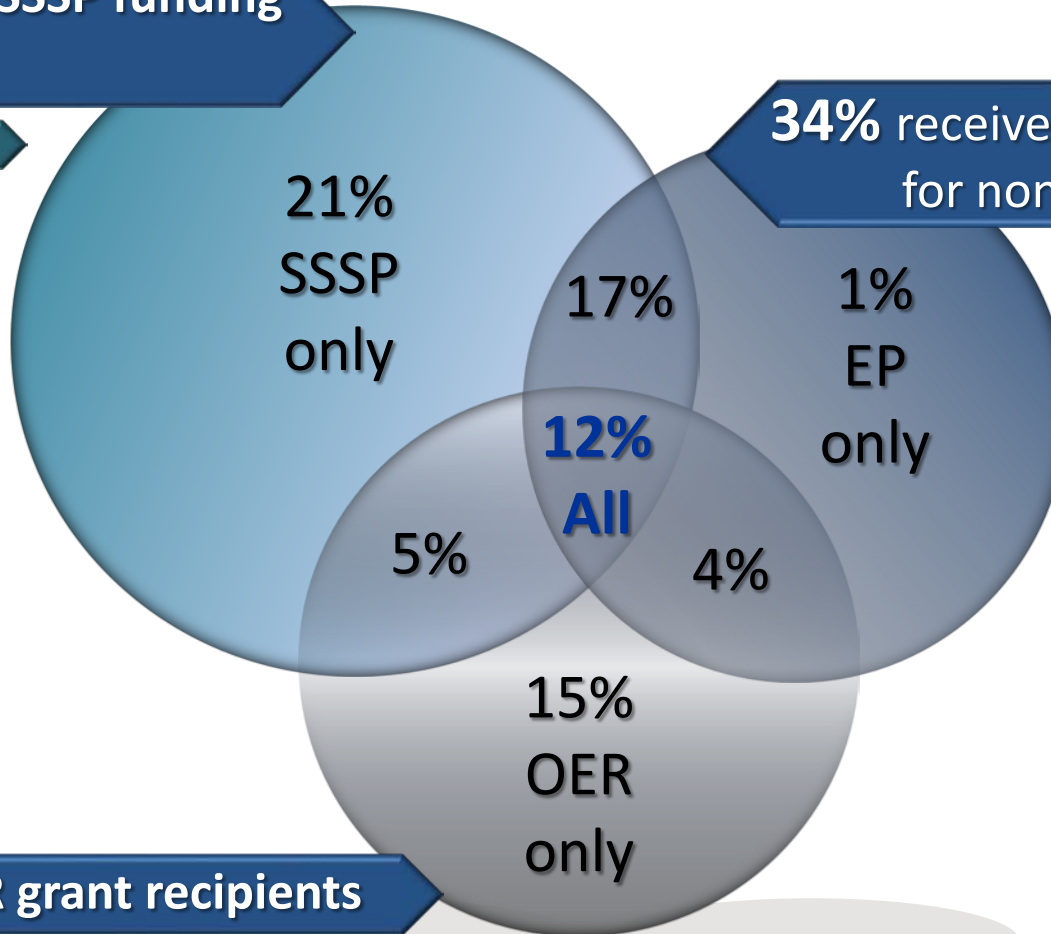
Funding

55% receive SSSP funding for noncredit

100% large

34% receive Equity Plan funding for noncredit

75% large

Planned Offerings and Processes

Certificate Development

72% of institutions with **noncredit DSPS** have interest in developing CDCP certificates for **students with disabilities**.

100% large

67% medium

70% small

66% of institutions with **noncredit Emeritus** have interest in developing CDCP certificates for **older adults**.

75% large

56% medium

73% small

Projected Growth

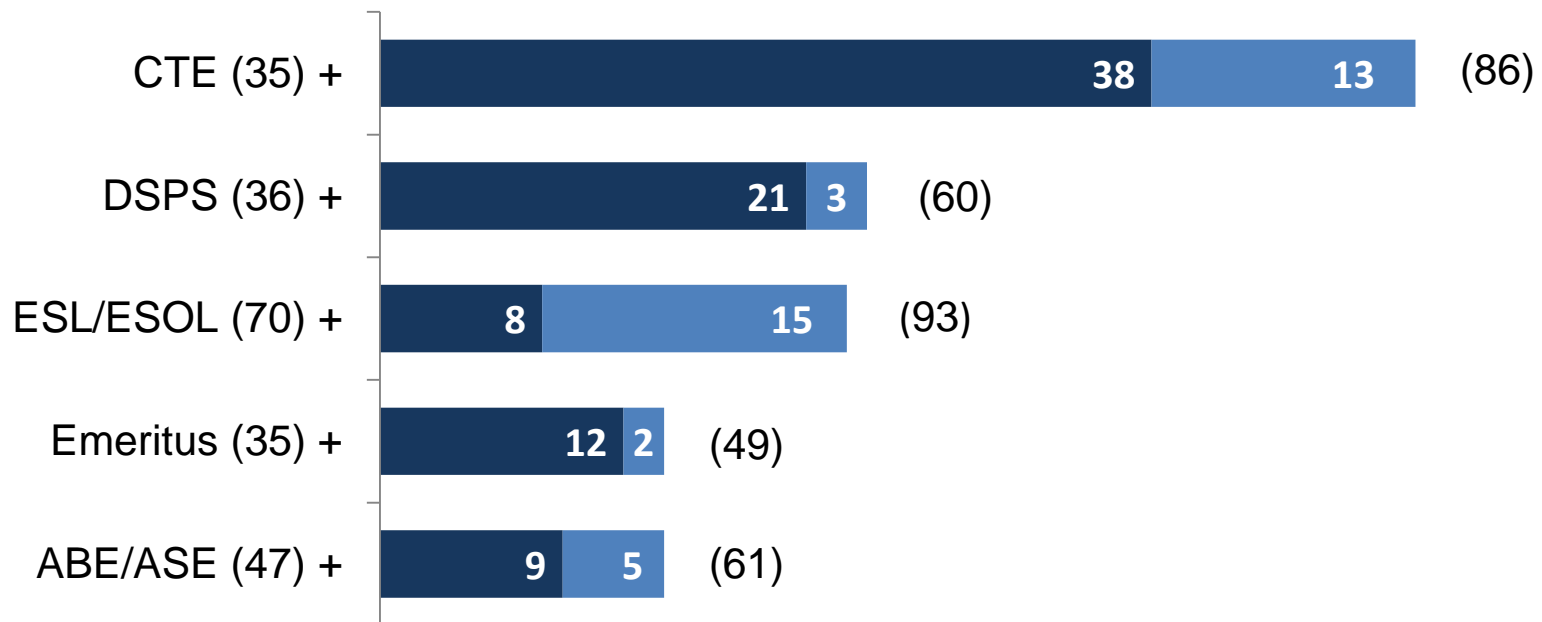
82 Institutions with noncredit offerings

+19 credit only institutions to introduce noncredit offerings

Projected noncredit increase

63% of institutions with noncredit plan expansion

58% of credit only to offer noncredit

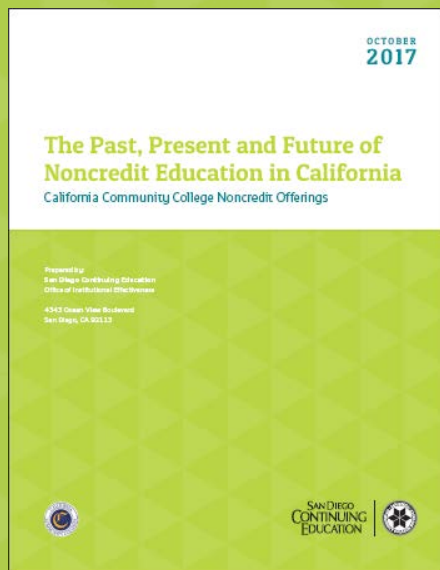

Report Recommendations and Statewide Advocacy

Prioritized Recommendations (noncredit coalition)

- ✓ Implement a census –based formula for managed enrolled classes
- ✓ Include DSPS and emeritus at an equalized (CDCP) rate
- ✓ Develop a stronger noncredit infrastructure to support program development at the state level
- ✓ Include noncredit funding allocations in the initial release of statewide initiatives
- ✓ Modify title 5 to allow for noncredit internships
