

LEARNING ABOUT INSTITUTIONAL EFFECTIVENESS

Talking about data, By IE Dean Michelle Fischthal

- ◆ SDCE's Research and Planning Analyst (and we only have one Jessica Luedtke) has to manually package data before it can be used for analysis. What does this mean? Any analysis outside of enrollment counts or demographics requires extensive pre-work prior to being able to then code and analyze the data.
- Why does CE have an extra and prolonged step of packaging data and the credit side does not? In our student system there is no student academic history or associated programs for CE students. CE has to manually code raw data that often differs by program and even course in an attempt to create these cohorts. It is sometimes not feasible due to how our students enroll and attend classes. Additionally, CE confers both course and program certificates, but they can't be differentiated within the system. This necessitates much more coding in order to tie back to student cohorts.
- What CE does have is the expertise and knowledge of our Research and Planning Analyst.
 Jessica has been working with CE data for years and understands it like no other.
- Please use the research request form if you have requests for information or research.
 While we may be struggling with limited resources to complete all requests, it enables us to evaluate what is most wanted to appropriately prioritize our work.

OIE staff are collaborating with statewide data advisory groups on noncredit data definitions.






