Spring FLEX is the annual kick-off for SDCCE's student learning outcomes assessment cycle! Spring FLEX is the time program faculty begin to review course SLOs, select an SLO to assess, and plan an assessment activity for students to demonstrate mastery of the SLO. The SLO Updates & Student Learning Journey workshop offered during spring FLEX will review SDCCE's SLO assessment process, including timesavers, using existing data, and this year's SLO assessment week.

The High School Equivalency Program (HSEP) Closes the Assessment Loop

Closing the assessment loop refers to the use of assessment results to improve teaching and learning within a course or instructional program. As a part of SDCCE's program review for program improvement process, programs are asked to state one SLO and describe how the program used assessment results to improve teaching and student learning. Below is an excerpt and best practice from the HSEP program review question 11.

HSEP 403 - Reading 2

Course SLO - Determining the author's or speaker's purpose or viewpoint

Our High School Diploma (HSD) and High School Equivalency (HSE) programs have established a best practice by aligning grades with course competencies such that student grades are determined by student performance on course competency assessments that tie to course SLO. Using the SLO for HSEP 403 listed above, faculty and students can easily track student progress and expectations are clear. Students know what the minimum score is to pass each competency and what they need to do retake and pass the competency if needed. Additionally, if faculty notice that a large number of students are struggling with a particular competency they can revisit, revise and/or supplement the course material to support student success in the course.
