The Technology Committee, Co-Chaired by Dr. Greenberg, provided updates on Zoom usage. Employees must ensure they are using the district-issued Zoom account instead of outdated or prior school accounts to avoid technical issues. Training is available upon request, and distance education instructors are required to complete an online course to ensure proper usage.

- h. Manager Screening Committee Composition <u>AP 4200.6</u> Draft <u>Proposed Revision</u> Discussion Summary:

The Academic Senate President proposed sharing the draft language for screening committee composition with other Senate presidents for feedback. A meeting will be held to refine the language further and address raised concerns. The proposed language emphasizes equitable faculty representation, requiring a minimum of two faculty members per school for managerial hiring, with the option to include faculty from other colleges if needed.

The Senate was updated on the <u>AP 4200.6 proposed revision</u>: the hiring of managers. The senate body suggested additional revised language to state: "Manager screening committee composition shall be comprised of an equal number of faculty, classified professionals, and administrators." The committee requested that a conversation be held with other colleges to clarify and ensure consistency.

The importance of faculty involvement in the hiring process was emphasized, with a call for more faculty members to participate, including serving as Equal Employment Opportunity (EEO) representatives, and Richard requested to be informed if faculty experienced any challenges in these roles.

i. AFT Updates | <u>Flyer</u> | Bromma Discussion Summary: John Bromma provided an update on the U.S. House of Representatives' recent vote to pass the Social Security Fairness Act (H.R. 82), which would fully repeal the Windfall Elimination Provision (WEP) and Government Pension Offset (GPO). Bromma encouraged members to contact their senators to urge a quick vote on the legislation, which is seen as a crucial step to ensure fair retirement for public employees. Ending the WEP and GPO is a key priority for the AFT, and members are urged to take action. Additionally, Bromma covered the upcoming tailgate event for the Gull hockey team.
