- 3. Union update (Holzknecht) Thank you to everyone for participating in the May Day teach-in. The union is in the process of updating the CBA. You can respond to the CBA survey created by J. Your union campus representative can advocate for CBA changes on your behalf.
- 4. PPIS Process Review (Weinroth) The senate and budget committee agreed that the PPIS review process be reviewed and include the voice of the faculty. After the spring visit from ASCCC, it became clear that faculty may only recommend how allocation is spent. The Budget Committee is only a recommending body. Action item. R. Weinroth is going to talk to VPA Sabanos to determine if the district has a policy to not provide printing services to students.
