Discussion	<ul> <li>Esteban shared "Recommendation for Board Policy 3930-Display of Flags by Campus Diversity Advisory Committee (CDAC)" for DEI committee's feedback for cultural event calendar.</li> </ul>
	• John Bromma suggested adopting a policy for primacy of the flags with a straightforward, rational procedure.
	<ul> <li>Ildifonso suggested to include Arab-American Heritage Month (January) and advises to be conscious of Hispanic Heritage Month due to the many countries having different flags and having to chose which flag to display.</li> </ul>
	• Harvey shared that a national flag has significance for diplomatic reasons, and although we mean well, the ordering of flags may be interpreted differently from different perspectives. Harvey suggests a symbol that represents [for example] National Hispanic Heritage Months opposed to individual Nations.
