Instructional Services

Update by Minou Spradley for Vice President, Instructional Services

- Started the new enrollment process, as of Dec. 4th we have 11,807 valid enrollments. We are at 38% capacity and we are only a week and half into the enrollment process. We have tripled since last year. Approximately 150 people on the waitlist.
- Had a wonderful discussion at the Academic Senate meeting about the enrollment process and shared their questions with Dr. Carter. She is hoping to have answers at the next meeting after she collaborates with Dr. Carter. They would like to see how the whole enrollment process plays out before they make any adjustments.
- A&R had an open zoom "help desk" available to assist any students with issues. Everything went very smoothly.
- Groupings and accessibility issues seemed to have been resolved (J. Molina)
- Per R. Weinronth, there is a concern about the VSSC, his students (3) have not been able to get served in a timely manner, he is requesting to have more staff available to assist the students, but he was able to help them student himself. However, Dr. Spradley has shared that ESL has no more appointments available, they have filled 300 appointments for December. She will speak with Dean Jarrell about other options.

SDCCE Foundation

Update by Neill Kovrig, President of SDCCE Foundation

- Thank you to those who have created the space to assist students with the scholarship application.
- 101 applications have been received to date
- Moved to Friday, April 26th; looking to present a different platform for this event and to have the students interact with the donors prior to the actual ceremony.
- Foundation has been engaged with an outside source for the Executive Director position. Dr. Boger has agreed to stay on until we have identified the new ED.
- Will be using the same firm to search for a new Fiscal Services manager for the Foundation. This person will focus on grants, etc.
- ETI is continuing to move along with the programs.
- ASB travel fund, students may have representative at the district level, but the foundation has created line item to identify a policy to distribute funds to our students.

Roundtable:

R. Weinroth: More content to the ASCC plenary discussion: Resolved, that the Academic Senate for California Community Colleges recommend that the cost-transparency requirement in California Education Code 66406.9 as modified by AB 607 (Kalra, 2023) be interpreted to include all instructional materials as defined in California Code of Regulations, Title 5, 59402.

As to CCCApply to ensure that the standard application is modified to allow for the collection of data on justice-involved students needed to advocate for equitable allocation of student services and resources.

Resolved, that the Academic Senate for California Community Colleges work with the CCC Chancellor's Office to simplify the application process by designing it to be user-friendly and accessible to all applicants, regardless of their prior experience with high education.

That the Academic Senate for CCC encourage all local academic senates to prioritize a discussion on supporting the counseling needs for noncredit students, whether through an identified noncredit counselor or counseling faculty who are supported with professional development on counseling for noncredit students; and resolved the Academic Senate for CCC provide resources and tools to support and share effective practices in counseling noncredit students by fall of 2024.
