#### **Presentation**

Online Core Student Services, by Esther Matthew, Dean of Counselling

- Dean Matthew introduced herself and background. Provided a brief introduction regarding the transition from office to home and Physical classes to virtual; which were sudden and unexpected. Reviewed some of the big challenges for staff, especially those with children at home. Pointed out that counselors have taken on multiple roles and truly stepped up to the challenge and adjusted as quickly as they could.
- Reviewed Assessment and facilitating student success. Reviewed functions and value of processes.
- Campus Labs update: Infrastructure complete; remaining tasks (CASAS). ABE/ASE CASAS testing implemented. Identified challenges and variables with CASAS. Next phase is CTE
- Online Assessment; using multiple measures in programs. CASAS reported testing challenges: Initial pilot, access to technology, student test environment, Equity
- Online Counseling: Individual appointments; utilizing technology. Services: Education, Career Counseling, follow-up support, referral to resources, personal and crisis counseling; support institutional events; ex: Promise

Program. Brief discussion followed about Zoom. VP Sabanos reminded members that Ingrid Greenberg sends emails with Zoom updates

- Online Orientation: Provides goal achievement support designed to provide students with information in a timely manner. Mentioned SDCE Orientation video. Process includes orientation video, specifics about program information and student requirements, tech approaches including Zoom, YouTube, Canvas, Screencast-O-Matic
- Shared about online core services including ConexED online platform; Pilot, enhanced educational planning; described the information that is provided. Excited about the pilot and vetting. Brief discussion followed regarding assessment and planning, and enhanced assessment features.
- Michelle shared that SS is meeting about assessment and placement in a few weeks.
- Rachel Rose thanked Esther on behalf of faculty.

Carlos shared that SDCE name change is being discussed and it could be a topic during upcoming accreditation. Pointed out that people are often confused by our current name; they can't understand what our institution is or does and he explained a brief history of our college and evolution of the name. Technically adult education is "post-secondary" education; it is college! Carlos believes that changing the name will elevate our organization and will better serve us. This topic will be shared at upcoming Academic and Classified senate meetings.
