3.5 USC Race	e & Equity Center's California Community College Racial Equity Leadership Alliance
	We have been invited to be part of the USC Race & Equity Center's California Community College Racial Equity Leadership Alliance, which gives us access for free to previous learning modules on specific topics.
	Modules will be released virtually throughout the year, one per month in Spring and Fall semesters.
INFORMATION	<ul> <li>Learning modules will focus mostly on strategies and practical approaches to achieving racial equity, learning and teams is encouraged with all session recordings and materials made available through equity connect, the learning platform.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>The session recordings are watched individually and use the discussion questions to bring the topic closer to your particular campus context and strategize collective action steps.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Carla feels this is great to bring to departments and program meetings, and should promote this more in the DEIAA Committee meeting, with the possibility of creating learning communities and flex for faculty.</li> </ul>
