3.2 Convocation Feedback Survey				
INFORMATION	The Convocation Feedback Survey was sent out last week, with the link available in the agenda and in an email from Margaret Braun. Convocation included keynote speaker Tim Wise, along with presentations from college leaders and the Go Green Committee. There was strong positive feedback, particularly for Tim Wise's keynote. Building on this momentum, there is a proposal to hold community conversations reflecting on his speech and related DEIAA themes.			
3.3 SDCCE Community Conversations: Friday, September 26th at Chavez 1:00-2:30				
INFORMATION	Esteban and Jhelen Ramirez will host the first community conversation on Tim Wise's keynote Friday, September 26, from 1–2:30 p.m. at the Chavez campus, with lunch at 12:30. This will be the first of several conversations, including three in-person sessions (Chavez, Mid-City, and ECC) and an online town hall, to provide both in-person and virtual options in response to IEPI and PD feedback. These discussions are being coordinated through the Campus Diversity Advisory Council (CDAC), with the goal of expanding to district-wide events led by diversity coordinators at each campus. The September 26 session will serve as a model for future college and district-level conversations.			
3.4 Request f	or Volunteers: All African Diaspora Application Review Committee			
INFORMATION	The district will send representatives from each college to the All African Diaspora Educational Summit Conference in Ghana in 2026, with the application process launching early this year to allow time for review, leadership approval, communication, and participants' visa and vaccine requirements. The application form will be shared soon, and those interested in serving on the application review committee are asked to RSVP by October 31.

3.5 CalPro Professional Learning Community				
INFORMATION	CalPro is launching a yearlong Professional Learning Community Institute that includes two multi-day sessions, three webinars, online work, and site-based implementation. The program provides a framework for school improvement through student learning and embedded professional development, helping participants strengthen facilitation and make data-informed PD decisions. Each agency may send three participants to form a seed team, making this a valuable, no-cost opportunity particularly suited for ESL and Adult Basic Education/High School Diploma faculty, including adjuncts.
