SDCE Foundation

SDCE Foundation update by Neill Kovrig, Classified Senate President for Laurie Coskey, Executive Director SDCEF

- Foundation Advance (as opposed to Retreat) is Wednesday September 16 from 8am-11am.
- Continues to discuss development planning for the remainder of this year.
- Announced the cost center budgeting and resources implemented for students, including continuing administering scholarships and educational programs

President Carlos Turner Cortez stated the foundation's mission is to support our students and programs. Continued discussion of significant growth in the Foundation's revenue. Commended Executive Director Laurie Coskey's participation, particularly over Summer 2020. "Since July, we have already generated \$2 million dollars to give to students. Due to AFT Guild, CARES, United Way, and have been able to make a difference in supporting students holistically."

Discussion continued to commend SDCE's emergency response to Coronavirus closure and organized course of action.

Guide Planning and Resource Allocation

Reviewed Priorities (increase enrollment for online programming, etc.), Emergency Support and Readiness has been amended to allocate for pandemics.

Reviewed ongoing plans for Institution's Goals/Learning Outcomes, Internal/External Program Pathways, Maintain a Balanced Budget, continuation of Pathways. Matthew Rivaldi, Academic Senate VP recommended streamlining Faculty Registration, particularly when moving towards OEI CVC. Star Rivera-Lacey, VP Student Services discussed how data and priorities were taken.

Amendments to 2020-2021/2021-22 Priorities:
