3. OLD BUSINESS

A. Cultural Curriculum Audit

Discussion: Reviewed two common trends found in the collaborative document generated during the February meeting by committee members and guest: conduct curriculum audit on both Course Outlines of Record (COR) and Syllabi. Feedback was also noted regarding the use of data and stakeholder feedback to identify equity gaps. Richard Gholson opened the floor for discussion. The benefit of reviewing Long Beach City College's findings was discussed. Lee Thompson proposed for consideration incorporating curriculum audit in a faculty institute. Veleka Iwuaba noted the importance of considering impact on students and student journey. Discussion included obtaining and using existing data, including program review data, and working with PRIE if additional data is needed. Michelle Fischthal proposed for consideration conducting an exercise with a program area. Marne Foster proposed a two-step approach by identifying areas in need of change and then identifying impacts of change. Creating a rubric for curriculum audit discussed. Discussion continued. Action: Committee to continue discussion as necessary to identify next steps. **Action:** Committee to explore drafting a rubric to support cultural audit of CORs. Action: Foster advised they may be able to bring back some information to the committee for consideration. Iwuaba advised the same. Robert Jackson noted they may be able to share a sample scorecard for consideration.
