This year's **SLO** Assessment Week (April 14–18, 2025) brought faculty together through engaging events designed to strengthen assessment practices and uplift equity-minded teaching. The week kicked off with "SLO Basics & Using AI," where Marne Foster provided the basics and Czarina Piniol introduced backward design strategies for aligning AI-generated prompts with course outcomes. Faculty also tuned in to a spotlight presentation at the Academic Senate, led by Marne Foster, emphasizing the college's progress in institutional assessment.

Midweek, faculty were encouraged to focus on their assessments and connect during the SLO Committee Meet & Greet. With the latest round of information available from the SLO data collection survey (May 6th), all programs are now represented in the data! From 2024/2025, there have been assessments reported from 10,730 enrollments. Flashing back, this is 2% less than the final total assessed from the last academic year (10,950 enrollments), though there are still submissions coming in. From this academic year's pool, 8,619 enrollments, or 80%, have met the necessary criteria for their course's SLO. There were a total of 132 different courses assessed out of 274, or 48% of courses at SDCCE. This is a 38% increase from the last academic year! Meaning, while slightly less assessments have been reported, these assessments come from a greater diversity of courses.

Diving further to look at specific programs from this academic year, Child Development has information from each one of their courses represented, or 100% course representation! With this, they have over half of their enrollments represented. Hospitality and Culinary Arts has the highest representation of assessed students with 368 assessments out of 429 — 86% of their enrollments have been represented. Other programs with high enrollment representation include Healthcare and Clothing and Textiles. The program with the most assessments reported is Emeritus (4,248) followed by English as a Second Language (3,531).

🌟 Faculty Spotlight: Kirsten Lachenmayr & Alphonso Brown





Today's faculty spotlight shines on the dedicated coaches of San Diego College of Continuing Education's Cyber Security Competition Team. Did you know we had one? Well, meet Alphonso Brown and Kirsten Lachenmayr—the driving force behind the team since Spring 2021. They began with any students they could recruit and have competed every Fall in the National Cyber League, which hosts nearly 5,000 teams, and every Spring in the Southern California Cyber Cup Challenge. That's right—they've never missed a season!

In Spring 2024, the team—formed the year before—had built solid momentum through multiple competitions. Fun fact: four of the students were enrolled in a **ukulele class** to meet eligibility requirements! (Any SDCCE class counts—you don't need to be in IT or cyber security.) The idea was to keep things fresh and avoid burnout, and it worked—they took **first place** in the Cyber Cup Challenge! Since then, team members have moved on, including their captain, who landed a cyber security job in Las Vegas and credited her competition experience for helping her stand out. That same team placed in the **top 70 nationwide** in the Fall league. So, here's to Alphonso and Kirsten—creating incredible learning opportunities, expanding access to tech careers, and taking students all the way to the top.
